RE: *Southwest Power Pool, Inc.*, Docket No. ER12-_____
Submission of Notice of Cancellation

Dear Secretary Bose:

Pursuant to section 35.15 of the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (“Commission”) regulations, 18 C.F.R. § 35.15, Southwest Power Pool, Inc. (“SPP”) submits this filing to notify the Commission of the cancellation of the following agreements: (1) Service Agreement for Point-To-Point Transmission Service (“PTP Agreement”) between SPP as Transmission Provider and Southwestern Public Service Company (“SPS”) as Transmission Customer (“SPS PTP Agreement”); and (2) Service Agreement for the Resale, Reassignment or Transfer of Point-To-Point Transmission Service between SPP as Transmission Provider and Kansas City Power and Light Company (“KCPL”) as Transmission Customer (“KCPL Reassignment Agreement”).¹

Background and Notice of Cancellation

On December 29, 2009, in Docket No. ER10-513-000, SPP filed the SPS PTP Agreement because it did not conform to the form of PTP Agreement set forth in the SPP Open Access Transmission Tariff (“SPP Tariff”).² The SPS PTP Agreement granted SPS the capacity to transmit 100 MW of energy from West Plains Energy to KCPL from June 1, 2010 to January 1, 2012. On February 22, 2010, the Commission accepted the SPS PTP Agreement.³

Subsequently, SPS reassigned the 100 MW of capacity in the SPS PTP Agreement to KCPL. To accommodate this reassignment, on March 31, 2010, in Docket No. ER10-979-000, SPP filed the non-conforming KCPL Reassignment Agreement. Specifically, the KCPL Reassignment Agreement granted KCPL 100 MW of capacity from West Plains Energy to KCPL from June 1, 2010 to January 1, 2012. The Commission accepted the KCPL Reassignment Agreement on May 18, 2010.⁴

Because the SPS PTP Agreement and KCPL Reassignment Agreement terminated on January 1, 2012, KCPL made a new request for Point-To-Point Transmission Service. Accordingly, KCPL now is taking service under two new PTP Agreements between SPP and KCPL designated as Original Service Agreement No. 2215 and Original Service Agreement No. 2216 (“Service Agreements 2215 and 2216”). Service Agreements 2215 and 2216 each grant KCPL the capacity to transmit 50 MW of energy from West Plains Energy to KCPL from January 1, 2012, to January 1, 2017. Both agreements conform to the *pro forma* PTP Agreement and therefore, will be reported solely in SPP’s electric quarterly report (“EQR”) commencing in the first quarter of 2012.⁵

As the SPS PTP Agreement and the KCPL Reassignment Agreement have terminated by their own terms, and KCPL will be taking service under two new agreements, in accordance with §35.15(a) of the Commission’s regulations, SPP files this notice of cancellation of the PTP Agreement and the KCPL Reassignment Agreement.⁶

Effective Date, Waiver, and Service

SPP requests an effective date of January 1, 2012 for the cancellation of the SPS PTP Agreement and the KCPL Reassignment Agreement and a waiver of the Commission’s sixty day notice requirement to permit such an effective date.⁷ Good cause exists for such waiver because January 1, 2012 coincides with the date that the SPS

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PTP Agreement and the KCPL Reassignment Agreement terminated by their own terms and the effective date of Service Agreements 2215 and 2216, pursuant to which KCPL now will take Point-To-Point Transmission Service from SPP.
