Reference: Changes to Southwestern Power Administration Pricing Zone Rates

Dear Mr. Brown:

On January 30, 2012, you filed on behalf of Southwest Power Pool, Inc. (SPP) revised tariff sheets reflecting an update to the rates for transmission service applicable to the Southwestern Power Administration pricing zone. Pursuant to authority delegated to the Director, Division of Electric Power Regulation – Central, under 18 C.F.R. § 375.307, your submittal in the above referenced docket is accepted for filing effective January 1, 2012, as requested consistent with the *March 5 Order*.¹

Notice of the filing was published in the Federal Register with interventions or protests due on or before February 21, 2012. Southwestern Power Administration filed a motion to intervene. Notices of intervention and unopposed timely filed motions to intervene are granted pursuant to the operation of Rule 214 of the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure (18 C.F.R. § 385.214). Any opposed or untimely filed motion to intervene is governed by the provisions of Rule 214.

This action does not constitute approval of any service, rate, charge,

classification, or any rule, regulation, contract, or practice affecting such rate or service provided for in the filed documents; nor shall such action be deemed as recognition of any claimed contractual right or obligation affecting or relating to such service or rate; and such action is without prejudice to any findings or orders which have been or may hereafter be made by the Commission in any proceeding now pending or hereafter instituted by or against any of the applicant(s).

This order constitutes final agency action. Requests for rehearing by the Commission may be filed within 30 days of the date of the issuance of this order, pursuant to 18 C.F.R. § 385.713.
