Dear Mr. Brown:

On February 22, 2012, you submitted, on behalf of Southwest Power Pool, Inc. (SPP) a Notice of Cancellation of a Large Generator Interconnection Agreement (LGIA) between SPP as Transmission Provider, Northwest Energy Center, LLC (Northwest Energy) as Interconnection Customer, and KCP&L Greater Missouri Operations (KCPL-GMO) as Transmission Owner. Pursuant to authority delegated to the Director, Division of Electric Power Regulation – Central, under 18 C.F.R. § 375.307, notice that the above referenced agreement is cancelled is accepted effective January 20, 2012, as requested.

Notice of the filing was issued with comments, protests, or interventions due on or before March 14, 2012. Under 18 C.F.R. § 385.210, interventions are timely if made within the time prescribed by the Secretary. Under 18 C.F.R. § 385.214, the filing of a timely motion to intervene makes the movant a party to the proceeding, if no answer in opposition is filed within fifteen days. The filing of a timely notice of intervention makes a State Commission a party to the proceeding. No comments, protests or interventions were filed.

This action does not constitute approval of any service, rate, charge, classification, or any rule, regulation, contract, or practice affecting such rate or service provided for in the filed documents; nor shall such action be deemed as recognition of any claimed contractual right or obligation affecting or relation to such service or rate; and such action is without prejudice to any findings or orders which have been or may hereafter be made by the Commission in any proceeding now pending or hereafter instituted by or against any of the applicant(s).

This order constitutes final agency action. Requests for rehearing by the Commission may be filed within 30 days of the date of issuance of this order, pursuant to 18 C.F.R. § 385.713.
