

Question: You state that the structured date range is August 5th to the end of September. Will there be a day set aside for us to submit our own data?

Answer: The structured tests in Settlements are intended to trigger certain Charge Types based on the scenarios that have been created. The month of October has been set aside for unstructured testing. During this time, MPs will be able to submit their own data.

MPs can submit their own data if desired for any Operating Day, but during the time SPP is trying to trigger a scenario and the data is not correct, SPP will overwrite the data as needed in order to perform the scenario.

Question: If I submit my own data for BSS and it doesn't work, you'll use your original data that you provided to us?

Answer: Yes, if the data is not correct, SPP will overwrite the data if necessary in order to perform the scenario.

Question: Will determinant data be available for us to pull?

Answer: Yes, all input data will be available and on the same timeline as the Statements.

Question: Is there a schedule of scenarios.

Answer: No. We expect that 80-90% of the Charge Types will be triggered by default in the month of August. We will be performing a gap analysis to determine which Charge Types have not yet been triggered, and then we will create a plan for triggering the remaining scenarios.

Question: Can we just submit bogus Disputes for testing purposes?

Answer: Yes, just make sure you note in the Subject and Full Description fields that the submittal is for testing purposes.

Question: With regards to Re-Settlements and Finals, do we submit new Meter Data for a Final?

Answer: Yes, data will need to be re-submitted for the Final, but not for R1 or R2.

Question: Will we be getting a Settlement posted for long day in November?

Answer: Yes, you will be getting a Statement; however, the timing may be more in early November, not on the normal schedule.

Question: When will we be able to start submitting our own Meter Data?

Answer: October 1st is due on October 5th

Question: If the last date we get Statements is on November 1 (10/18 Final and 10/25 Initial), how are we going to get statements for long day on November 3?

Answer: Long day does fall during our scheduled switchover period from SMT to parallel operations but long day must be tested to make sure the systems handle the extra hour. In order to accommodate this SPP will be posting long day statements but during the switchover period long day will be the only day that is posted and the timing of when it is posted may not be right on OD+7. We will provide a Statement that contains representative data, which is not supported by the market. The primary focus is to ensure that the extra hour is treated correctly, not on the upstream data.

Question: Do we have a timeline for when TCR data that will be used for Settlements?

Answer: The dates that were used during Phase 2 of the TCR Market Trials (6-1-2013 to 5-31-2014). Settlements will contain test data from the Annual and Monthly TCR Auctions for August 4.

Question: When and where will the State Estimator data be available?

Answer: It will be available on the Meter Agent Report card on OD+1 approximately 8:00 a.m. or 9:00 a.m.

Question: The Traceability is very clear, but when will more complex Charge Types with flags be presented?

Answer: The more complex Charge Types such as Make-Whole-Payment will be presented next month and at the Fall User Conference in October.

Question: What scenarios will be exercised during Market Trials?

Answer: There are 19 (after removal of 2 scenarios, there are 17) scenarios that we will be exercised during Market Trials, and we will be discussing those next in the presentation. Here is a high level list of scenarios:

- 1.0 'Base' Energy & Operating Reserve Settlement
- 2.0 Make-Whole Payment
- 3.0 Regulation Non-Performance
- 4.0 Contingency Reserve Deployment Failure
- 5.0 Demand Response Resource *
- 6.0 Day-Ahead Non-Asset Energy
- 7.0 Real-Time Non-Asset Energy
- 8.0 'Base' Energy Import/Export
- 9.0 Energy Import/Export – MWP Distribution
- 10.0 Real-Time Regulation Adjustment
- 11.0 Out Of Merit Energy
- 12.0 'Base' Virtual Energy Transaction
- 13.0 'Base' TCR Auction Settlement
- 14.0 TCR Auction Settlement – End of Month
- 16.0 'Base' TCR Settlement (removed from Market Trials Scenario)
- 17.0 TCR Settlement – End of Month
- 19.0 TCR Settlement – DA Market Fails to Solve (removed from Market Trials Scenario)

Question: Is the Make-Whole-Payment Distribution a part of the Make-Whole-Payment Scenario?

Answer: Yes

Question: You mentioned that we can submit Disputes in August and September, but only for calculations, not data. What is window for submitting Disputes?

Answer: You can submit Disputes throughout structured Market Trials for any OD for calculation reasons. During Parallel Operations, you may submit Disputes for both data and calculations.

Question: If we do not receive all Charge Types, do we report which ones are out of scope?

Answer: We will publish a scorecard which shows which ones we have seen.

Question: Are the Settlements Scenarios on SPP org, if so, where are they located

Answer: Yes, they are and here is the link: <http://www.spp.org/section.asp?group=2739&pageID=27Revised> Settlements Scenario (v6) in the items listing, and also in the first zip folder

Question: When times are listed, are they Central Standard Time (CST)?

Answer: No, they are Central Prevailing Time (CPT)

Question: In the Charge Type Scorecard, what is the difference between % MPs Hit, and % MP Passed?

Answer: The % MP Hit reflects the Charge Types that MPs have hit. The % MPs Passed reflects the Scenarios that MPs have passed. Passed means the MP has seen the scenario 3 times.

Question: Does that mean we have passed or SPP thinks we have passed?

Answer: The % MPs Passed reflects the % of MPs that have hit specific scenarios 3 times.

Question: Where is the Charge Type scorecard is located?

Answer: We will have it by end of week and will be sent out to everyone.

Question: Can we put all of the links on the presentation and get the presentation re-posted?

Answer: Yes, we will add the link to the presentation and have it re-posted along with notification regarding the re-posting.

Question: In reference to the Charge Type scorecard. Does it mean that we as MPs have seen the Charge Type or that we feel the Charge type is calculated correctly?

Answer: SPP will be tracking in order to determine if you have or have not seen it and have you seen it at least three times. Once the Charge Type has been hit 3 times, the cell will turn green. MPs should submit a Dispute if they disagree with calculations.

Question: You mentioned that flags on the complex Charge Types will be presented later or at the Fall Conference.

Answer: Yes, we discussed that some of the topics presented during the Fall Conference would be focused on the Make-Whole-Payment, Bill Determinants and how stitching works, etc.

Question: When Determinant Reports are created, when will they have all Settlement Locations for OPPD?

Answer: Anything that has been registered for the August 1 Commercial Model updates will be represented during Market Trials.

Question: Since the data is based on SPP data, how will we know what Charge Types should and should not apply to us?
