("SPP") Membership Agreement and Attachments O and Y of the SPP Open Access Transmission Tariff ("OATT"), SPP provides this Notification to Construct ("NTC") directing Nebraska Public Power District ("NPPD"), as the Designated Transmission Owner, to construct the Network Upgrades.
