






RTO GOVERNANCE STRUCTURE



COMPOSITION OF THE BOARD

- Shall consist of up to 10 persons, but not less than 7 persons
- Shall be independent of any Member
- One Director shall be the President of SPP
 - Excluded from voting on business related to office of President
- Comply with conflicts of interest policy
- Three year terms
- No term limits



BOARD OF DIRECTORS



Qualifications: Recent and relevant senior management expertise and experience in one or more of these disciplines:

- Finance
- Accounting
- Electric transmission or generation planning or operation
- Law and regulation
- Commercial markets
- Trading and associated risk management

Purpose: The board of directors will manage the general business of SPP pursuant to the SPP bylaws.



SPP BOARD OF DIRECTORS: DUTIES

- Direct activities of all SPP organizational groups
- Serve on SPP organizational groups
- Authorize all substantive contracts and debt
- Select and review the performance of SPP officers
- Approve amendments to the SPP bylaws
- Approve amendments to the SPP membership agreement
- Authorize regulatory filings
- Solicit and consider straw vote of Members Committee in advance of taking any action
- Appeals: any member can appeal to the board of directors if they disagree with an action or inaction from a committee





CORPORATE GOVERNANCE COMMITTEE

SPP CORPORATE GOVERNANCE COMMITTEE

- Oversee the BOD election process
- Monitor the composition of the Board of Directors to ensure:
 - Balance
 - Independence
 - Maintenance of qualifications under any applicable laws
 - Avoidance of conflicts of interest
 - Periodic review of the criteria for independence
- Recommend compensation levels for the Board of Directors to the Membership



WESTERN MARKETS EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE (WMEC)

- Representatives of each non-affiliated WJDA signatory
- Forum in which SPP and WEIS participants collaborate to finalize market rules
- WMEC has authority to:
 - Approve/reject tariff amendments
 - Establish market protocols
 - Recommend proposed amendments to the WJDA
- SPP board gives significant recognition to WMEC in their ultimate oversight of WEIS






WMEC VOTING

Voting – House and Senate style approach

- House vote weighted based on WMEC representatives NEL as a proportion of total NEL for all WEIS participants
- Senate vote equally weighted for all WMEC representatives
- Resolution must pass House and Senate to pass

Autonomy Related to Markets + Exclusive Issues

Pathway for Markets+ Participants to Integrate into SPP RTO governance as Western RTO footprint expands



INTRODUCTION OF GOVERNANCE OPTIONS

- Option #1: Modify existing SPP RTO governance structure
 - Include Markets + Sector Representation, as SPP Members, on Standing RTO Committees
 - PLUS Minimal Autonomous governance framework for Markets+ exclusive issues
- Option #2: Robust autonomous Markets+ governance framework
 - Would establish Markets+ "governing body" with certain authorities and a nominating committee for the governing body for SPP board review
 - PLUS additional committee structures (participants committee, committee for states, other etc.)
- Option #3: Combination of Options #1 and #2
 - Robust autonomous Markets+ governance framework
 - PLUS Modifications to SPP Bylaws for SPP Board qualifications and Corporate Governance Committee composition
- Other Options?

*Autonomous governance framework options could leverage WRAP governance concepts and structures or create new structures/concepts
