Pursuant to Section 3.3 of the Southwest Power Pool, Inc. ("SPP") Membership Agreement and Attachments O and Y of the SPP Open Access Transmission Tariff ("OATT"), on April 12, 2016 SPP issued a Notification to Construct ("NTC") No. 200365 directing Southwestern Public Service Company ("SPS"), as the Designated Transmission Owner, to construct the specified Network Upgrades.

Subsequently, SPP concluded that the Network Upgrade listed below should be withdrawn and informed the appropriate organizational groups of the withdrawal in accordance SPP Business Practice 7060 Section 7.1.
