

## 2023 ITP Final Project List

- **Action Required**

SPP staff requests stakeholders review the updated 2023 ITP draft project list and provide feedback. The final list of projects for the 2023 ITP has been posted to [GlobalScape](#). The intent of this project list is to show the top-ranking projects staff has identified to solve the remaining needs which have not been addressed by model adjustments, previously issued NTCs, or operating guides. This marks the end of portfolio optimization and consolidation.

The final project list incorporates feedback from stakeholders and includes the Study Cost Estimates received by SPP. stakeholders should review the cost estimates and notify SPP if there are any impactful monetary differences. In addition, stakeholders should review projects for feasibility and notify SPP if the posted project is not feasible to construct.

- **Due Date and Method of Submittal**

Feedback regarding the updated draft project list should be submitted via the SPP [Request Management System](#) (RMS), using the "Submit an Inquiry" **Request Template**, "Integrated Transmission Planning (ITP)" **Subtype 1**, and "Data Submission" **Subtype 2**. Feedback related to the draft project list is requested as soon as possible but no later than **end of day Friday, August 25, 2023**.
